# KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

Project support was critical to the formation of the National Watershed Management and Agroforestry Platform (NWAMP). The project created synergies with government stakeholders at National, Zone, and District level.

Tree-based value chain development enterprises in areas targeted for scalingup were trained and supported with production materials that generated incomes of USD 5,876, thereby contributing to improved livelihoods.



The quality and quantity of tree seedlings in government and community nurseries have been improved through better technical training, tree varieties, and material support. There are now some 30,000 government-run tree nurseries in Ethiopia.

**Communication and** visibility campaigns reached across the country by the means of radio and television broadcasts and the dissemination of leaflets, posters, brochures, newsletters, and FMNR manuals in local languages.
