Example of policy engagement 1

Outcome mapping focused on behavioral change:

- Identify policy engagement opportunities
- Plan and enable interactions and cross-learning
- Track the resulting changes and adapt (e.g., the JRLMs)

Examples of engagement:

- Northern Ghana Restoration Initiative (NRI)
- Senegal transhumant corridors
- Niger FMNR decree
- Agroforestry strategies in Ethiopia and Kenya

Example of tool and policy engagement 2

Virtual & in-person cross teams and country learning towards advocacy for change:

- Virtual cross-country webinars: Gender Mainstreaming, Value chains, Youth, Faith as an incentive to land restoration, etc.
- Cross-country policy learning visit to Niger.



Example of policy engagement 3

Bridging science-policy-practice to bring back the data and evidences to the countries:

- Final SHARED workshops
- Evidence and experience wall



Opportunities

- Mobilize support behind the evidence-based science-practice policy work interface in the countries and regions.
- Build wider collaboration among stakeholder across scales to achieve national aspirations and targets.
- Initiating a community of practice regionally around our approach.

A targeted approach that is inclusive and evidence-based builds coherence and greater success for land restoration outcomes.
